BIGGER THAN ANY SYSTEM

Often, people tend to be very consistent with a particular human system of theology instead of being consistent with the tensions of the Word of God. This, in reality, puts the thinking of men over the revelation of God.

Often, people dogmatically assert that their "system" de facto represents the whole truth of Scripture. But the fact is that God and His truth is BIGGER than any human system. To try and force God's truth through the strict grid of any particular system invariably results in the compromise of God's truth.

I, too, champion the sovereignty of God, but not at the expense of what the Bible says about human responsibility. Charles Spurgeon was very definitely Calvinistic through and through. However, he was of the ilk that put Scripture ahead of his systematized theology when he saw a conflict. That is why both Calvinists and Arminians alike selectively quote Spurgeon approvingly at various points.

I believe that the spirit of Spurgeon at this point is humble and godly and one we should seek to emulate.

"My love of consistency with my own doctrinal views is not great enough to allow me knowingly alter a single text of Scripture. I have great respect for orthodoxy, but my reverence for inspiration is far greater. I would sooner a hundred times over appear to be inconsistent with myself than be inconsistent with the word of God." --C.H. Spurgeon as quoted by lain Murray in SPURGEON V. HYPER-CALVINISM, p. 151

"It is the duty of every theologian to subordinate his theories to the Bible, and teach not what seems to him to be true or reasonable, but simply what the Bible teaches."--Charles Hodge – SYSTEMATIC THEOLOGY, II, p. 559

Leaders, labels, and libels. Regarding the age-old debate over God's sovereignty and human responsibility, undoubtedly, eternity will reveal many errors and shortcomings. Indeed, "Eternity shall be at once a great eye-opener and a great mouth-shutter." (Jim Elliot) People tend to put great stock in leaders whom they admire, and seemingly quote and follow them as the final authority.

However, the true Biblicist will faithfully hold to the "tensions" of Scripture as presented in the Scriptures without altering anything that God has revealed.
